Menthol tobacco use is a health equity and social justice issue

Targeted marketing of menthol to communities of color (e.g., Black, Hispanic/Latinx)

Disproportionate use of mental cigarettes in Black communities

Higher rate of lung cancer among Black smokers compared to non-Black smokers



Agenda setting happens on social media and policy makers pay attention

Attention

debate around the menthol ban on social media

Volume

Large amounts of online content generated by policy events

Activity

Active social media response with anti-regulatory sentiment

Uncertainty

Uncertain about opinions of those most impacted by the policy

Social media listening and analytics provide an opportunity for near real-time monitoring of public opinion

Measures amount and diffusion of online posts



Relies on expert input to train the algorithms and interpret results

May be prone to bias in machine learning

Can miss the lived experience of the audience of interest if they are not posting

We wanted to understand how people who identify as Black/African American and Hispanic/Latinx think and feel about the recently proposed ban on menthol cigarettes and the effect it will have on their communities.



Created a way to help us determine how best to engage community in research

Wanted Black and Latinx people to help us look at our process for collecting and analyzing social media data

Advance our understanding of the intersection of anti-regulatory sentiment and the menthol ban on social media







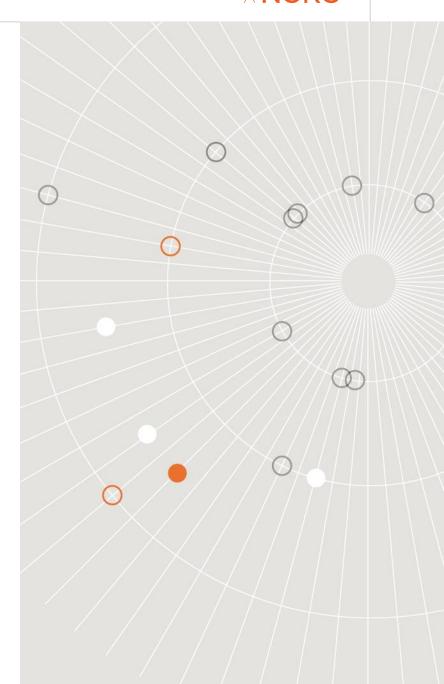


Methods

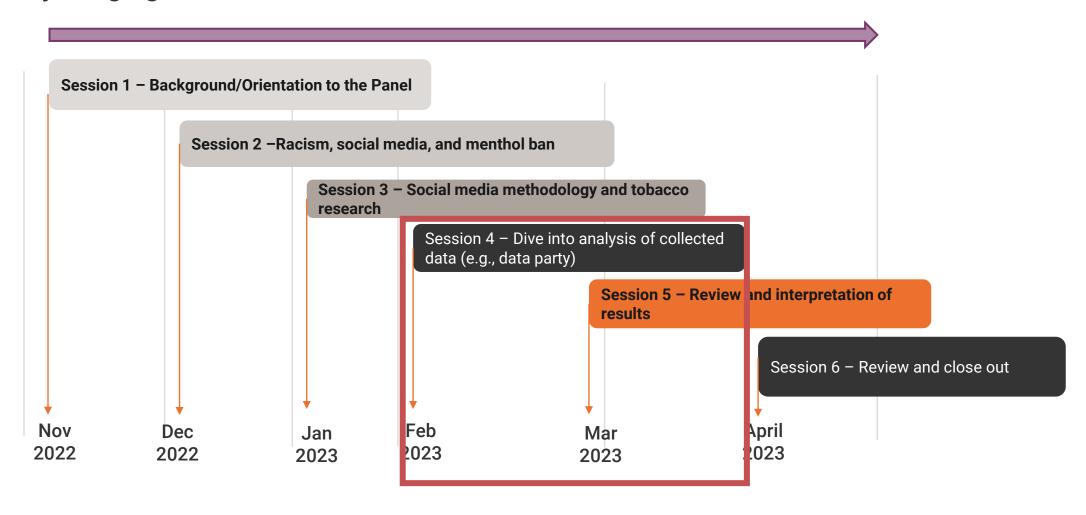


The community engagement panel (CEP) reviewed our process for collecting and analyzing social media data and discussed the best ways to involve their community in research.

- Participated in six 90-min sessions
- Learned about the research methods SDC uses, the menthol ban, and related findings
- Examined social media narratives around the menthol ban and discussed opportunities for counter messaging related to mis and disinformation
- Reflected on and discussed how individual and community-level social media habits may or may not intersect with tobacco research



Community Engagement Panel Timeline



A virtual data party is a timelimited event of 2-3 hours where diverse audience members come together to collectively analyze data in a culturally responsive and equitable way.

Why host a data party?

- Increase audiences' knowledge of area
- Improve interpretation
- Identify differences in people's perceptions
- Increase audiences' capacity to understand and use data
- Empower
 participants/community
 members' voices and
 incorporate/ affirm
 lived experience

- Identify what data might still be needed
 - Increase audiences' ownership of data
 - Build consensus on the results & conclusions
- Develop more realistic recommendations
- Increase buy-in for later implementation
- Inform better programming and policies.

We reviewed 2 weeks of data collected after April 28th, 2022

Tweet examples covered themes challenging the menthol ban on the basis of:

- •Illicit Market
- Government Incompetence
- Government Persecution

The group was not in agreement with the tweets and offered counterarguments; namely that the harm from the menthol cigarettes themselves far outweighs the harm that might come from the ban (including possible increases of illicit market activity and police response).

The group seemed more responsive to the claims in the tweets, acknowledging that they, too, are concerned about criminalization of menthol products, and that any ban on the manufacturer level must be paired with strong de-criminalization efforts so that individuals selling untaxed products do not face unintended consequences.





"There are instances of states that have banned the sale and there is no data supporting black markets and increased police interactions. On social media, it sparks emotion without data to back it up. These are just thoughts on what could happen without proof."

Conclusion



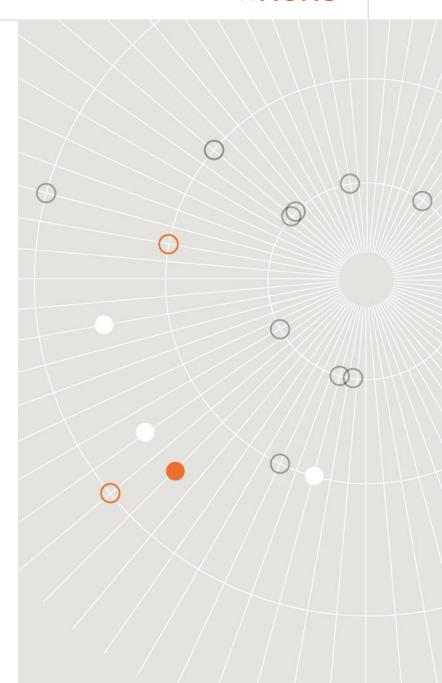
Engaging community in social media research is essential to:

- Understanding how to minimize bias in the social listening algorithms
- Ascertaining if the social media content reflects the lived experiences of people impacted by the issues

- Determining whether and how much the industry oppositional narrative is shaping opinions of communities most affected by the ban
- Learning if these oppositional messages are reaching and influencing these communities
- Exploring how best to reach and counter the oppositional messaging

How will we continue to harness the power of social media and leverage community voice?

- Add an intersectionality lens by working with individuals who identify as Black or Latinx and LGBTQIA+
- Identify more community-based partners to assist with recruitment
- Continue to investigate how the tobacco industry is coopting the narrative related to the menthol tobacco ban on social media
- Explore opportunities to use the community engagement panel approach with youth, adolescents, and young adults
